Increase motivation to study as well as to improve the employability of graduate


 Increase motivation to study as well as to improve the employability of graduate students,

DUAL EDUCATION AS AN INCLUSIVE FORM OF EDUCATION

 The project will support all stakeholders from Montenegro to address the challenges facing their higher education institutions, HE system and economy, like labour mismatch and employability, improvement of quality of teaching and quality of learning outcomes, relevance for the labour market, and equity of access through better opportunities for socioeconomically disadvantaged groups.



 Dual education is inclusive form of education that offers opportunity to disadvantaged groups of students to find the employment quickly through improved match between skills supply and labour force demand.





DUAL EDUCATION AS AN INCLUSIVE FORM OF EDUCATION

- "Improving the match between skills supply and labour force demand represents one of the key challenges for building inclusive labour markets." (Gerbery D., 2016).
- Students in the dual education have the right to a financial reward ranging from 50% to 100% of the hourly minimum wage.
 Higher number of students from low-income
- Higher number of students from low-income families at dual studies by 10% in comparison with classical studies.
- Increased number of employed graduates from disadvantaged socio-economic groups.
