Status of PhD students at the University of Montenegro

What is the legal status of PhD student?

All students in Montenegro, at all levels, may have double status: being a student and at the same time they may be employed (being a student and work at the same time).

Before 2003
Full time students (unemployed)
Part time students (employed)

After 2003

There is no difference between employed and unemployed students

- a) Employment status and student status are not correlated: Status of PhD student does not provide you benefits of employed person. But sometimes being a PhD students is prerequisite to be employed.
- b) Most of the PhD students are already employed, but their everyday work has nothing to do with research.

Being employed as a teaching assistant at UoM and being a PhD student at the same time: downsides

- Large number of PhD students are employed at the UoM as <u>teaching</u> assistants. They do not see themselves as <u>students</u>, they do not see themselves as <u>researchers</u>. They are teaching assistants whose primary duty is to give practical lectures. They will do research in spare time.
- The level of teaching assistant salary depends on the number of lectures.
 More lectures means more money. Most of the teaching assistants, PhD students, ask for more lectures. Bottom line: teaching assistants has limited time for research.
- There is no clear benefit for finishing PhD studies on time.

Tuition fees for PhD studies

- Realization of PhD studies cost some money. Important question is: who is going to pay the real cost of studies: students, University, government?
- Until 2017 all teaching assistants at the UoM were exempted from paying tuition fees.
- New Higher education law, article 69a: All PhD students are paying the tuition fees.
- Teaching assistants/PhD students at UoM are paying 1/3 of full price, but nevertheless we need better solution, article 69a shoould be changed
- Solution a) best PhD students should have status of employed person at the university (status of research assistant and salary)
- Solution b) best PhD students should study for free, as long as they are the best

How present/future employment status of PhD student affects the number PhD students at the UoM?

- "Why do I want to become PhD student?"
- a) I want a career at the university (research institute, faculty). Typically, the only way to become professor/researcher at the UoM, is to start your career as a teaching assistant. Otherwise chances to find first job at the UoM at latter stage, after finishing PhD, are slim. I will enroll PhD studies only if I have a chance to be employed as a teaching assistant
- Conclusion: fewer vacancies for new teaching asistants means fewer new PhD students at UoM
- b) I want a research career in the industry (This is rare in Montenegro)
- c) PhD diploma It is important for my present job (PhD diploma is the end of their research career)
- d) I love science, I love doing research, I am not thinking right now how PhD will reflect my professional career
