

Policy debate: JM networks in the field of higher education

Type of Activity	Max amount €	Min. N° of organizations	Duration
Network on internal EU issues - thematic: "Future of Europe"	€ 1.000,000	Min. 12 higher education institutions from 7 different EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme.	3 years
Network on foreign policy issues — thematic: "Europe in the world"	€ 1.200,000	Min. 12 higher education institutions with at least 6 participants from third countries not associated to the Programme.	3 years



Jean Monnet 2021-2027: award criteria



Note: Each of the award criteria has a max of 25 bodies. To be considered for funding, the proposal must score at least 70 bodies, min 15 bodies in each criteria.



Jean Monnet Call 2022: indicative roadmap

Steps	Dates
Publication of the call 2022	24 November 2021
Deadline for submission of applications	1 March 2022
Evaluation period	April –June2022
Notification of results to applicants	max. 6 months after submission deadline
Preparation of Grant Agreement/Decision	max. 9 months after submission deadline



Erasmus+ Virtual Exchanges



What are 'virtual exchanges'?

Online people-to-people activities that **promote intercultural dialogue and soft skills development**. They make it possible for every young person to access high-quality international and cross-cultural education (both formal and non-formal) without physical mobility.

They take place in small groups and are always moderated by a trained facilitator.

They should be easily **integrated into youth (non-formal education) projects or higher education courses**.



Specific objectives of this call

- Encouraging **intercultural dialogue** with Partner Countries and increasing tolerance through online people-to-people interactions
- Promoting various types of virtual exchanges, allowing more young people to **benefit** from intercultural and international experience
- Enhancing **critical thinking and media literacy**, particularly in the use of internet and social media
- Fostering the **digital and soft skills development** of students, young people and youth workers
- Promoting citizenship and the common values of freedom, tolerance and nondiscrimination through education
- Strengthening the youth dimension in the relations of the EU with Partner Countries



Timetable and budget

Deadline:

22 February2022

Budget available: 4 million EUR

Max EU grant per project: 500.000 EUR



Eligibility criteria: what must partnerships look like?

A minimum of 2 higher education institutions from 2 or more different Erasmus+ Programme Countries



A minimum of 2 higher education institutions from 2 or more different Partner Countries within the same Erasmus+ region

Or

A minimum of 2 higher education institutions from 2 or more different Erasmus+ Programme Countries



A minimum of 2 higher education institutions from 2 or more different Erasmus+ Programme Countries

Note: the number of organisations from Programme Countries may not be higher than the number of organisations from Partner Countries.
