- Short-term studies or traineeships abroad (2-12 months) that count to a degree back home.
- For staff (5 days – 2 months)

- Bachelor, Master and Doctoral level

- Grants to cover travel and living costs

- HEIs from EU MS and associated third countries may apply to their National Agency



Challenges for Montenegro

- Proactive role of vice-deans for international cooperation
- Coordinated approach when entering partnership schemes
- Analysis/database of the so far participation
- Involve underrepresented units
- Pay attention to regulated professions
- Make connection with companies from Montenegro
- Enable practical traineeship of students
- Prioritization in terms of fields to be covered
- Evaluation of students` opinion
- Obligatory inclusive approach from systemic level
- Valorization of practical traineeship done through recognition of credits
