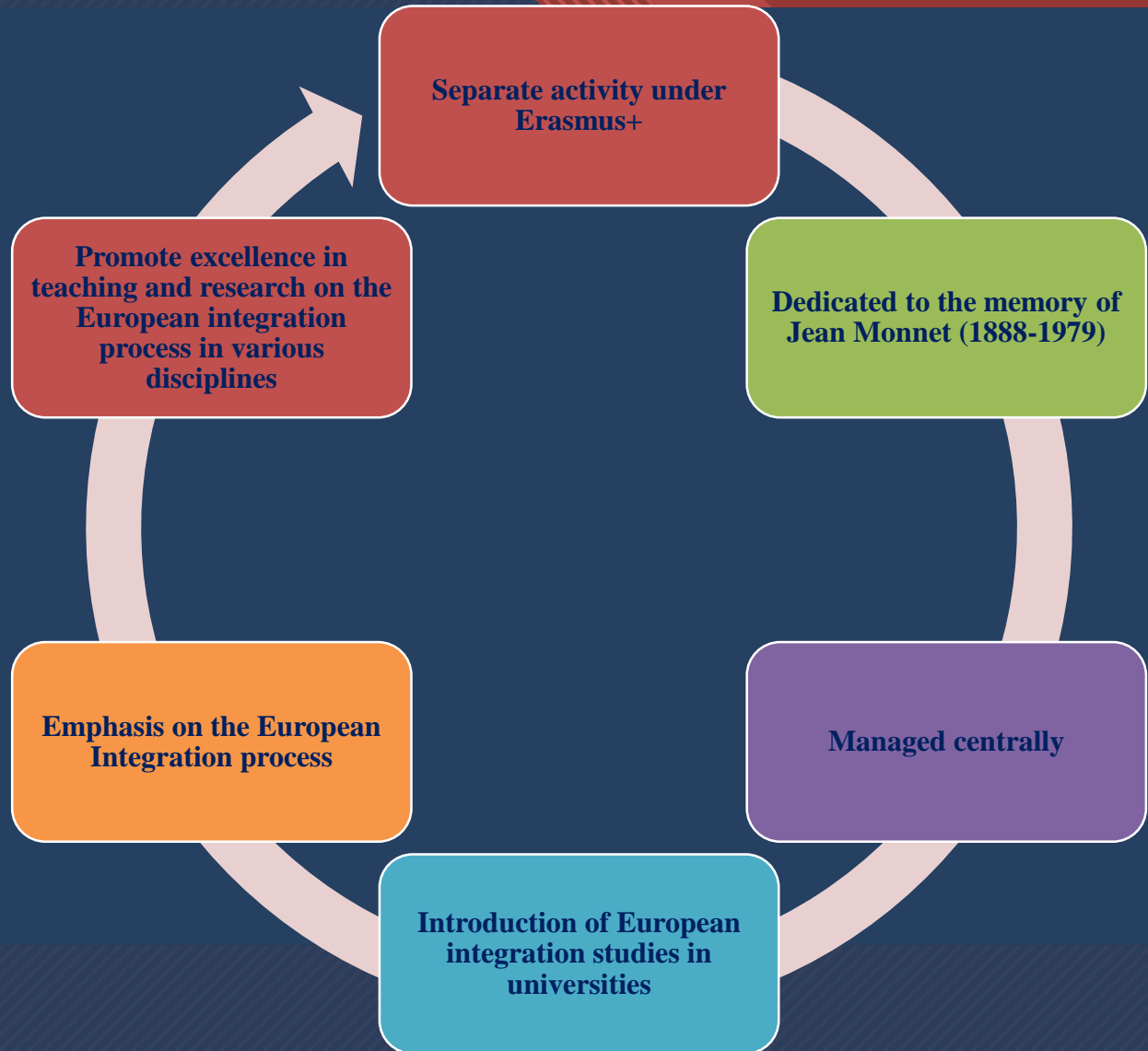

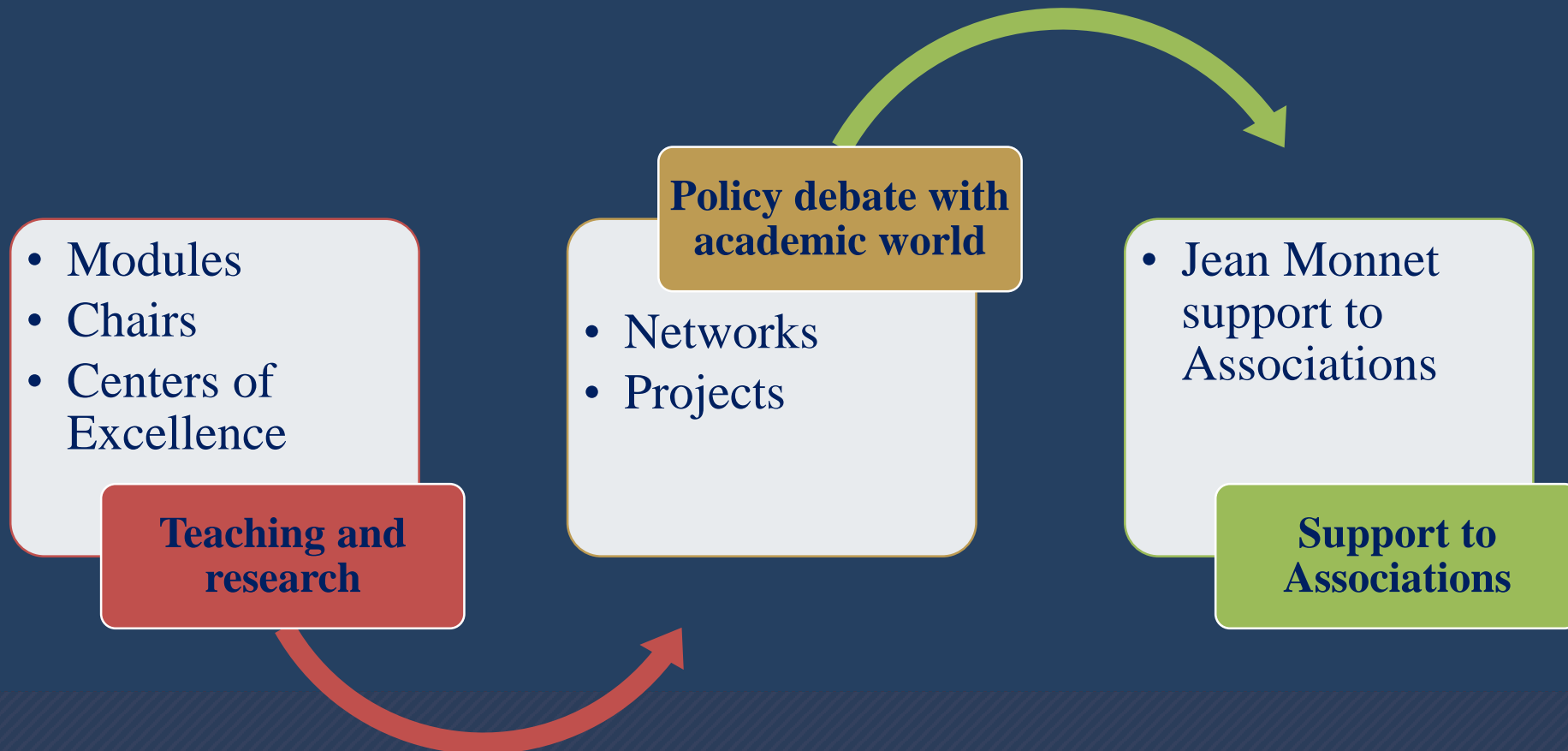

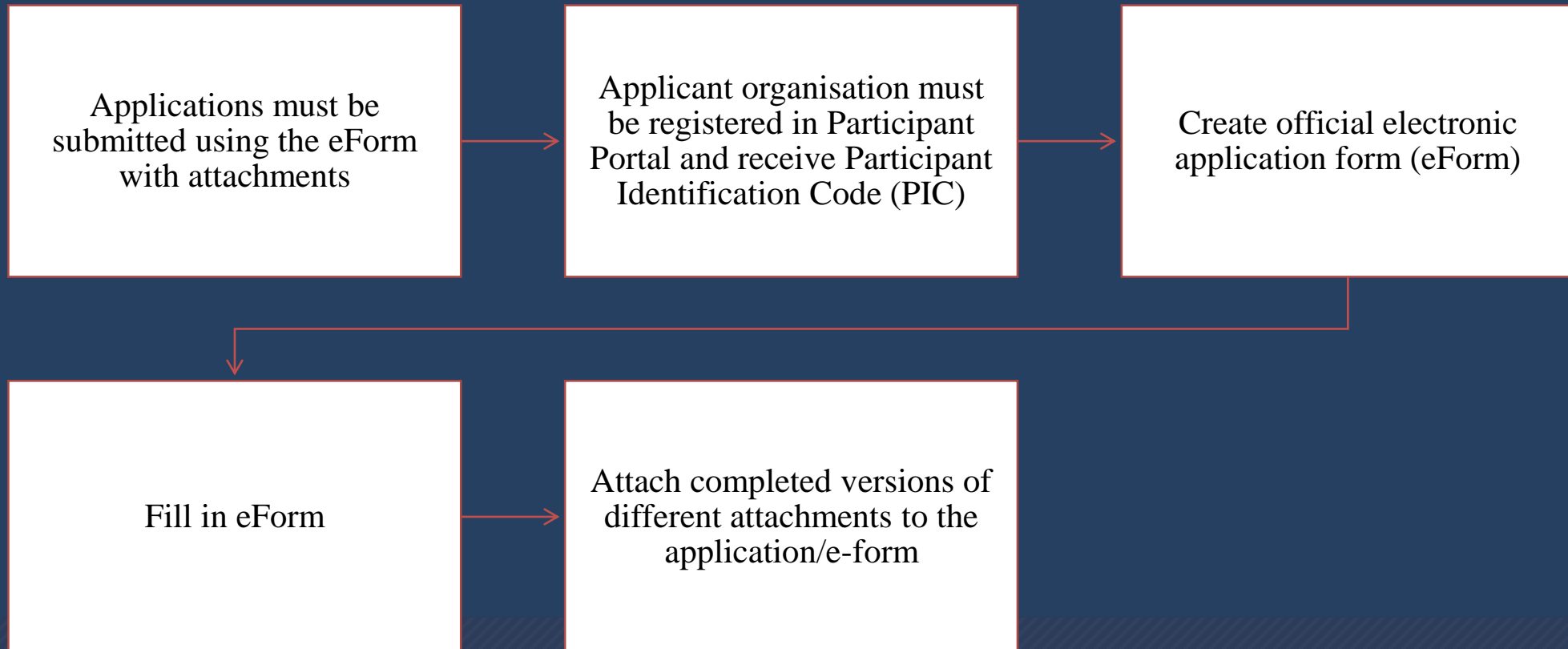

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Jean Monnet: how to apply?





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How to make a competitive proposal?

Before you start
you should have:

- A **project concrete idea** agreed and supported by all those who will contribute to it, your institution and if applicable your partner institution
- Comprehensive **knowledge about the Jean Monet action** under which you intend to apply for: know the objectives, priorities and formal requirements
- **Minimum number of partners:** The choose of the partners, their role and diversity and their relation to the project objectives and their early and active involvement on the preparation of the project proposal



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Project idea

Your project idea should **fit the objectives and priorities of the action** as specified in the Erasmus+ programme guide.

The institutions should be **interested in and capable of implementation.**

The idea must **reflect the strategy of one or several institutions participating.**



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Application tips

Have a comprehensive understanding of the precise elements under each award criteria and well as understanding the way independent experts will look at them when assessing your proposal.



Present all information in application and distinguishing features of the project and respond to all the so points of the award criteria paying attention to the specific contexts.



Make sure you explain the working methodology and provide evidence of your expertise with this respect and explain how all parties involved in the project will contribute to its implementation.



Describe your project in a focused and structured way.



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Application tips

Support your statement with facts and figures and use examples.



You know your project is rationale, make sure this is clear to a reader.



A successful proposal demonstrates that you will produce concrete and sustainable results for the benefit of the target group and all the stakeholders concerned.



Ask somebody who did not participate in the project preparation, to proofread it.



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The proposal should answer the following questions:

Why is your proposal important?

How will these activities happen?

By whom will it be implemented?

For whom is the proposal important?

When will these activities happen?
