- Enhanced student participation in a learning environment grounded in human rights principles of respect, equality and collaboration/participation
- Students with experience of working with and contributing to civil society

- Staff with the skills needed to develop human rights curricula at undergraduate and postgraduate levels that meet EU standards and provides a sustainable platform for ongoing curriculum development and reform
- Opportunities for staff to collaborate in and develop sustainable networks across the region

- Collaboration between faculties in order to enhance mutual understanding between staff in EU and partner countries and between partner countries.
